


# 1. Connecting your Duet via USB - MacOS

This Guide will provide the steps in getting you're Duet Connected via USB using a Mac OSX Computer.




## **INTRODUCTION**

### Please read before proceeding to avoid damaging the controller and voiding your warranty

- 1. Avoid connecting the Duet via USB when you do not need to. (Except when instructed to in the guides)
- 2. Always unplug the WorkBee Power Supply before connecting the USB Cable.

### Step 1 — Connect to you're Duet Via USB




- ↑ Do not follow this guide if you have the Ethernet version of the Duet.

  Please skip to this guide: 1.

  Connecting your Duet to a Network Ethernet
  - Connect the Duet to your Mac with the USB cable provided. Do not connect the power supply at this stage.

#### Step 2 — Mac OSX Terminal



- Mac OSX Users: Open Applications > Utilities > Terminal .
  - Run Is /dev/tty.\* Copy the result that has USB in the name. For example: /dev/tty.usbmodem1411
  - Run screen /dev/tty.usbmodem1411 115200. Replace "usbmodem1411" with the result you got above. Hit enter and you should see OK returned. You are connected successfully.

⚠ If you get an error, Sorry, could not find a PTY. unplug the USB, plug it back in and try again.

#### Step 3 — Check you're Connected



- When connected to the Duet in Terminal, what you type isn't displayed. Therefore it is best to type the commands into TextEdit and copy > paste into terminal
- The terminal output may keep scrolling saying it cannot find a wifi network. If so, please copy the text 'M552 S0', and in terminal quickly right click > paste > enter. If done succesfully the scrolling will stop.
- Send command "M115" to the Duet board.
  - The Duet will return the firmware version being used confirming the connection to the Duet.
- Leave the USB Cable plugged in and terminal open for the next guide.
- in all future guides when double quotation marks are being used, use straight quotation marks, These can be set in the System Preferences -> Keyboard on your Mac.
